2011 NATIONAL LATIN EXAM SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The National Latin Exam is pleased to announce the winners of this year's \$1000 scholarships. The NLE has designated one of these scholarships, given by an anonymous donor, as the Doris Kays Memorial Scholarship. Doris served for many years as Chair of the NLE Scholarship Committee. Our scholarship winners became eligible as high school seniors because they won gold medals on the 2011 NLE level III, IV, V, or VI exams. These scholars must take two semesters of Latin or ancient Greek language as college freshmen. They will be eligible to renew their scholarships each year if they continue their study of Latin or Greek. 



At the retirement last spring of Jane Hall, the founder and Co-Chair of the National Latin Exam, a new leadership team was named. Mark Keith, who served as Co-Chair along with Jane for the last 11 years, will continue in that capacity. After serving two years on the NLE's Advisory Committee, Matthew Webb has joined its Writing Committee. An eleven-year veteran of teaching Latin on the elementary, middle, high school, and college levels, Matt left his position with the Moultonborough School District in the Lakes Region of central New Hampshire last spring to move to the Boston area where he teaches Latin part-time with the public schools of Brookline, Massachusetts. REPORT ON THE JANE HARRIMAN HALL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

THE JANE HARRIMAN HALL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE

The Jane Harriman Hall Professional Development Scholarship is designed to support teachers in their ability to teach Latin. The scholarship was developed in honor of Jane Harriman Hall, founder of the National Latin Exam, in order to continue her efforts to bring high quality Latin instruction to students throughout the United States.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be current teachers of Latin at the pre-K—12 level in a public or private school who spend at least 50% of their instructional time with students. Applicants are eligible for the award only once every ten years.

FUNDING

Scholarships will be awarded based on the impact they will have on students and effective use of the funds. A total of \$5,000 will be allocated to the scholarship annually. This may result in one or more awards being given, based on the number and quality of the proposals.

TERM OF THE AWARD

This annual scholarship may be used any time from January through December of the year in which it is awarded.

The National Latin Exam has supported students and promoted the study of Latin for 36 years. During that time it has earned a reputation for being a challenging, fair, and popular measure of a student's understanding of the Latin language. By aligning the exam with the national standards and expanding the offerings to provide a better reflection of what is being taught in the classroom, the NLE has sought to adapt to the changes and expectations of modern-day Latin programs.

Teachers from across the country send the Writing Committee numerous requests and suggestions which are discussed and considered carefully. Sometimes the committee agrees that a suggestion would be beneficial, and a change is made. One of the most notable changes in recent years is permitting schools to administer different levels of the exam at different times, thus allowing programs with large numbers of students sitting for the exam to make more effective use of space.

Sometimes, however, suggestions are discussed and rejected. One of the requests made most often is for the NLE to reconsider the rule that Latin teachers are not allowed to administer their own exams. This rule, keeping the Latin teacher removed from the process of administering and handling the exams, is at the core of the philosophy of the NLE. On numerous occasions the committee has discussed the option of allowing teachers to administer their own exams, weighing both the benefits and the pitfalls of such a request. While the committee recognizes the inconvenience and difficulty that may occur in trying to find an outside administrator for the exam, it also feels that it is very important to insure that the exam is given properly and that the results reflect faithfully the abilities of the students being tested. In light of the many reports of irregularities and cheating associated with high-stakes testing around the country, the committee voted to keep in place the safeguards that protect the integrity of the exam.

ATTENTION TEACHERS:

Postmark Deadlines are firm!

The postmark deadline for mailing your application and payment for the 2012 National Latin Exam is **January 18**, **2012**. Applications postmarked **January 19 through January 28** will be considered late and MUST include the late fee. Applications postmarked **after January 28**, **2012**, will not be accepted. Check with your financial office to make sure that your application and payment are mailed by the deadline and to ensure that they are mailed to the correct address:

NATIONAL LATIN EXAM WRITING COMMITTEE

The individual members of the Writing Committee, all seasoned teachers with experience using a wide variety of textbooks and teaching methods, begin writing the exams each spring. By the middle of August the members, meeting together as a committee, begin the difficult task of reviewing each exam with respect to the level of difficulty, accuracy, and content. After numerous revisions, the exams are sent to the consultants for their in-depth critiques. Acting upon their suggestions, the committee makes further changes. After a final review, fine-tuning, and proofing, the exams are printed and sent to the schools.

It usually takes the committee twelve to fifteen sessions averaging three to four hours each to complete the work associated with the exams. In addition to the general working sessions, each committee member spends hours taking care of specific tasks such as answering correspondence, word processing, record keeping, publicizing the exam, and writing newsletter articles.

CREDIT CARD ORDERS FOR EXAMS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

Teachers are now able to pay for their 2012 National Latin Exams using a Visa, Mastercard, or Discover Card. Because it is most important to keep the application and payment from each school together, credit card payment information can be given in two ways. Teachers may fill out and mail in the application form for the 2012 exams, which has a space for credit card information, or they may submit through the NLE web site an online application with credit card information. Teachers should NOT fax their applications when ordering by credit card since faxed copies often are not legible. Credit card payments will not be accepted by phone since they would not be accompanied by the application form. There will be a convenience charge of \$5 for each application charged to a credit card.

DEAR NELLY

Dear Nelly,

My school registered for the 2012 exam, and we paid by check as usual. I noticed a new \$5 convenience charge on the application, so the check included this new fee. However, a couple of weeks ago the NLE sent our school a \$5 refund. Now I'm confused. Help!!

Baffled in Baton Rouge

Dear Baffled,

The new \$5 convenience fee only applies to credit card orders. Since you paid by check, you didn't owe this fee, hence the refund. The NLE is excited to be accepting credit card payments. For those who wish to pay in this manner, you can either fill in the credit card information on your hard copy of the application and mail it to the NLE office or complete the entire ordering process on our website, www.nle.org . If you choose the latter method, you will save \$0.44 in postage, as your application information is automatically transferred to us.

Dear Mally

Dear Nelly,

I'm so glad that the NLE has finally decided to accept credit cards! I plan to take advantage of this payment option when I apply for the 2012 NLE. Since I'll be using this new payment method, what's the best way to handle the application process?

Delighted in Des Moines

Dear Delighted,

We, too, are excited about making this new payment option available to our participating schools. The best way to apply by credit card is to do so online at www.nle.org. You can both fill out the application and pay online at the same time. We will receive your application and payment information electronically. By using this online service, you will save yourself paper, ink and postage, as well as a trip to the post office. In addition, you can be assured that we will receive your registration promptly so you won't have to worry about your application and payment getting lost in the mail or arriving with a late postage mark.

N.B. Even if you apply online & pay by credit card, you must place your order <u>no later</u> than January 18, 2012 in order to avoid the late fee.

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Dear Nelly,

I want to make sure that I get my application materials in on time in order to avoid the late fee. Your application states that the postmark deadline is January 18, 2012. Could you clarify what a postmark deadline is? Does that mean that the materials have to be in your hands by January 18, or does the envelope simply need to show that it was mailed on January 18 or before?

Meticulous in Mankato

Dear Meticulous,

Good question! A postmark deadline simply means that the envelope must have a postmark of no later than January 18, 2012. (Our final postmark deadline is January 28, 2012, but as you mentioned, there is a late fee attached to that later deadline.) There is no need to spend the extra money to send the materials Priority, FedEx, or UPS. As long as your envelope bears a postmark of January 18, 2012 or before, you will not have to pay the late fee. N.B.: The best way to ensure that you meet the postmark deadline is to take your envelope to the post office yourself and ask the postal clerk to hand stamp it with that day's date. Dropping your envelope in your school's mail system on January 18, 2012 does not ensure that it will receive the correct postmark. Don't get caught with a late postmark! Go ahead and mail your application and payment now.

DEAR NELLY CONT.

Dear Nelly,

Every August my school district sends a purchase order to the NLE for the upcoming year's exam. Usually the number of exams listed on the purchase order is slightly higher than the number of exams we actually need. This year was no different. But our school district goofed and sent a check based on the total amount listed on the purchase order without looking at our school's actual application. I then had to fax my application to the NLE office, and your office sent a refund check to cover the difference between the purchase order total and the application total. What can we do in the future to avoid this problem? Unsure in Uniontown



Dear Unsure,

When our office receives a purchase order from a school or school district, we send an invoice to the originator of the purchase order for the amount listed on the purchase order. In your case, the invoice went to the school district. Our invoice includes the following instructions: "Please note that applications are sent

to the schools in September. We cannot accept payment without the accompanying application. Therefore, please be sure to mail the payment with the application from the above school." For the future, you can make your school district aware that we do not accept payments without applications, and you can instruct them to wait to draft the payment until they have received your application. You can caution them to make sure that they make the payment for the total listed on the application, if the application and purchase order don't agree. The most important piece of advice we have is this: You may want to ask your school district to hold off on sending the purchase order until they know how many exams you'll be ordering. If you follow this procedure, the purchase order and invoice total will match the application total, and additional paperwork can be avoided on both sides.

ATTENTION: EXTRA FEES FOR EXTRA MATERIALS

For a variety of reasons, some of our participating schools request additional copies of the *Instructions for Examiner* forms (the "Blue Sheet") and return envelopes. The National Latin Exam is happy to fill these requests and reminds teachers of the extra fees for these materials. Schools that ask for between 11 and 50 extra blue sheets and return envelopes will incur an additional \$25 fee, while those requesting more than 50 will be charged an additional \$50 fee.

THE NATIONAL LATIN EXAM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The members of the NLE Advisory Committee represent the various geographic areas of the country, from both public and private middle schools, high schools, and colleges. Their job is to listen to suggestions that teachers around the country may have regarding the exams. When the Advisory Committee meets with the Writing Committee at the ACL Institute each June, these suggestions are presented and discussed. THE NATIONAL LATIN EXAM SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The NLE Scholarship Committee is composed of six readers: three college professors and three high school teachers plus the Chair. Only two professors and two high school teachers serve as readers each year. The applications are read several times prior to the selection of the twenty-one scholarship winners and five alternates. The first screening is done by the Chair. A second screening is then done to determine which applications will be sent to the readers. Approximately ninety applications are sent to the readers for a third reading. Each reader selects his top thirty-five applications and returns these selections to the chair. At this time, the committee members' choices are collated, and the winners are chosen. The names of the scholars are announced at The American Classical League Institute late in June.
